ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Admission to the Bachelor of Science in Accounting Program:

- Proof of high school graduation or GED certification
- A minimum of two years of significant full-time work experience beyond high school
- Submission of all required items for the admission process

CORE ENROLLMENT REQUIREMENT

A minimum of 60 transferable semester credit hours from a regionally accredited college or university is required to begin the core curriculum.

Contact your program representative for more information about prerequisite requirements. If you have 30 to 59 credit hours of previous college course work, call now to find out about our unique Bridge Program that will allow you to immediately start working toward your bachelor's degree.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

The total of 124 semester credits is required for graduation, which must include:

- 30 credits in Liberal Arts including:
 - 6 credits Philosophy/Religion and Biblical Literature (a minimum of 3 credits must be in Biblical Literature)
 - 6 credits English/Composition
 - 6 credits Social Science
 - 3 credits Math/Science
 - 3 credits Fine Arts
 - 6 credits Liberal Arts Electives (from any of the above listed categories)

The remaining credits may be earned through classes, CLEP, or Portfolio. In addition:

- Completion of the required core courses with a GPA of 2.25 or higher
- Cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher
- Payment of all tuition and fees

TUITION AND FEES (Effective July 1, 2007 to June 30, 2008)

■ Initial Deposit - \$100

After all application materials have been submitted and evaluated, an applicant will receive notification advising of his/her acceptance status. Upon acceptance into the program, an initial deposit of \$100 must be submitted to reserve a space in a class. The deposit must be submitted two weeks prior to date of the first class or immediately after acceptance if there are less than two weeks before the first class.

■ Total Cost

The total cost of the program is divided into several payments spread over the course of the program. The first tuition payment is due by 14 days prior to the first class. All subsequent tuition payments are due 3 weeks before the start date of each course. The exact amount of each payment varies based on the number of credit hours, fees, and the cost of books for the courses covered by the payment. For specific payment amounts and due dates, refer to a class tuition payment schedule.

- Tuition, books, and fees are fixed for students based upon the charges in effect upon enrollment in the core program unless the student withdraws, or changes any preset registration. In such instances the prevailing charges at the time of re-entry may apply.
- Books are not returnable for a refund.
- A \$50 charge will be assessed for any payment not received by the due date.
- A \$15 charge will be assessed for each check returned for non-sufficient funds.
- Initial deposit and payments may be made by check or telephone using VISA, MasterCard, or Discover. 800-621-8667 x2878 or 765-677-2878.
- Accounting Principles I (ACC201) and Accounting Principles II (ACC202) are prerequisites to the program, and must be taken prior to ADM201. Costs for these prerequisites are listed in the Tuition and Fee schedule above.
- Additional shipping costs apply to books shipped to Alaska, Hawaii, or international destinations. Students in these locations are charged the actual shipping cost differential in addition to the amount shown above.
